WHEREAS, the Redbud Tree has been designated the Official City Tree; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview was designated as a Tree City USA in 2019; and






WHEREAS, said property to be rezoned from RM-8 to RM-20 is located within the corporate limits of the City of Fairview; and


WHEREAS, Middle Tennessee Electric installs street lights within the city and the city pays the electric and maintenance costs for street lights within the city limits, and
