Ordinance #2018-18, An Ordinance to Amend the City of Fairview Zoning Ordinance by Changing the Official Zoning map for Tax Map 46, Parcel 087.00, Consisting of 48+ Acres, Located at 2451 Fairview Boulevard, From a RS-40 (Low-Density Residential) Zoning District to a CG (Commercial General) Zoning District – Commissioner Burks recused himself from discussion and voting. Commissioner Rainey offers concerns over rezoning such a large parcel until the comprehensive plan is in place. City

planner Kristin Costanzo offers there are not currently any specific plans for the property just preparing to make it more appealing for sale. City manager Collins mentioned the plans to enhance the intersection of Highway 100 and Cumberland/Crow Cut noting this will require right of way to be purchased. The topography of this land is hilly to the rear of the property and currently has a lot of trees. Our current regulations require a barrier between two types of zoning uses and the existing topography naturally creates that barrier.
