E. Discussion on the design for the Bowie Park Treehouse Playground Sign. (Parks and Landscape Board)

Representatives: Elmer Mobley and David Dodoro

Discussion: Mr. Mobley opened the presentation by thanking all the Parks and Landscape Board members for their work on this project. Mr. Mobley and Mr. Dodoro prepared a PowerPoint presentation with drawings of the proposed design for the board. Mr. Dodoro stated after several surveys it was determined that citizens wanted to incorporate the signage from the old playground in the design. He stated the sign is still in very good condition and can be used, which will allow the city to save money while also incorporating something from the old playground. The proposed design includes natural stone pillars with wooden columns. Mr. Dodoro said the P & L Board took into consideration safety, durability, and cost with the design. Mr. Dodoro said the intent will be to incorporate the donor sign into the stone pillars which will save additional funds. Mayor Anderson had concerns about the slopes potentially making one column

taller than the other. Mayor Anderson also suggested instead of using the wooden columns possibly using a tree trunk design. Mr. Dodoro also presented proposed signage pertaining to handicapped signs, caution signs, and safety signs. Vice Mayor Butler thanked everyone who worked on the sign design and asked what the next steps will be. Mr. Carter answered that after a design is approved the city can have it engineered. Vice Mayor Butler asked for this item to be placed on the October 19th, 2023, agenda.

Commissioner Hall – Commissioner Hall thanked all involved on the Parks and Landscape Board and Friends of Bowie for their hard work on the sign design. He also thanked city employees for their hard work and the ones who volunteered their time to potentially serve on the Water and Sewer Task Force.
